Easter SATs Revision Programme for Year 6 Students

Our team at **Into**University Hackney Downs would like to invite your child to a free SATs revision programme in the Easter holidays. Your child's school has put your child forward as they meet one or more of our eligibility criteria.

The sessions will run on Wednesday 12th of April, Thursday 13th of April and Friday 14th April 2023 and the sessions will be held at our centre from 10:00am – 3:00pm.

The two-day programme will cover numeracy and literacy topics that will be tested in the exams. During the sessions, we will be looking at SATS techniques and learning how to answer questions.

In addition we will be doing Wellbeing and Study Skills sessions that involve playing interactive games to develop the skills for exams and secondary school study. Our sessions are led by experienced education workers, they are fun and totally free!

On each day, students **should bring a packed lunch and a water bottle**; additional juice drinks will be provided.

Please see a full list of criteria for student eligibility:

A young person who meets one or more of the following:

- A young person eligible for Free School Meals (in the last 6 years)
- A young person eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant
- A young person who is, or has been classified as a Child Looked-After
- A young person in receipt of the post-16 bursary
- A young person living in social housing (i.e. his/her main carer lives in local authority owned housing or receives housing benefit or local housing allowance)
- A young person who lives in a household where the household income is £25,000 or less

A young person who does not fit into any of the above, but meets two or more of the following:

- A young person who will be of the first generation in his/her family to go to university in the UK
- A young person who is a refugee or asylum seeker
- A young person who speaks English as an additional language (EAL)
- A young person who has Special Educational Needs
- A young person who displays challenging behaviour at school and is at risk of or has previously been permanently excluded from school
- A young person who is a young carer
